### CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Branigan called the meeting to order at 6:33 PM. The invocation was provided, and the pledges were recited. In attendance were Liz Branigan, Mayor, and Councilmembers Chris Pezold, Kathy Canady, Crystal Mancilla, and Angela Jones. Tony DeYoung was not in attendance. Quorum was established.

## **PUBLIC COMMENTS**

David Kirschner, 950 CR 214 addressed Council regarding item 8.d related to the intersection of CR 214 and Hwy. 29 and how dangerous that area is. He stated that even on a clear sunny day recently, there were several accidents at that intersection.

Chad Cormack, 4147 CR 200 addressed Council regarding item 8.s related to filling a position on the Planning and Zoning Commission.

James Prince, 1651 Loop 332 – Main Street Social addressed Council regarding economic assistance for his business. He stated he has been here many years and would like to shed some light on what he sees. He stated Councilmember Pezold has been through his building, but no Mayor has been through yet. He stated he paid \$298,000 in LUE fees and would like an incentive to offset that. He stated it seemed he just does not know the right people and that there are no rules for assistance.

John Teague, 100 Shin Oak Lane addressed Council regarding item 8.s related to filling a position on the Planning and Zoning Commission.

Fred Johannessen, 129 Chickasaw Plum Drive, Leander addressed Council regarding item 8.s related to filling a position on the Planning and Zoning Commission.

Tim Anderson, 121 Magna Lane addressed Council regarding item 8.s related to filling a position on the Planning and Zoning Commission.

## **PRESENTATION(S)**

### **Operation Liberty Hill presentation by Susan Baker.**

Susan Baker, Director for Operation Liberty Hill provided a history of Operation Liberty Hill. She stated that in 2020, 1037 households were helped. She said that the thrift store supports half of their expenses. She is looking for a larger facility, ideally with the purchase of land with building. If land was donated, they could write grants to possibly build. She reviewed their numerous services provided. Ms. Baker stated she was not sure how Council could help but she welcomed their advice.

### **Presentation from Jake Thomas regarding baseball fields.**

Mr. Thomas, president of the Liberty Hill Youth League for baseball and softball, addressed Council regarding the baseball fields. He said the organization was founded in 1953. He stated they are currently out of fields. He asked Council for help with the cost of fencing three (3) fields in the amount of \$37,000. He stated they currently lease the fields from the school district and the ISD has approved building the fences. Mr. Thomas stated he is looking to partner with City Council, the Parks and Recreation Board, and Liberty Hill ISD. He is hoping to open these fields in March of 2022. There was discussion of where that money might come from.

**Presentation by Mundo & Associates on best practices, duties, and roles of boards and commissions.** Pam Mundo presented to Council. She encouraged diversity within the various boards and commissions and promoted members mostly coming from within the City limits as that is who is being governed by these boards and commissions. Council discussed the current parameters for the various boards and commissions.

### **REGULAR AGENDA**

DISCUSS AND CONSIDER ACTION ON BOWMAN CONSTRUCTION ON CHANGE ORDER IN THE AMOUNT OF \$8,500 IN THE FORM OF HOURLY RATES AS ACCRUED, FOR CONSTRUCTION ADMINISTRATION SUPPORT THROUGH COMPLETION AND CLOSE OUT OF DOWNTOWN BIKE-PEDESTRIAN LOOP PROJECT.

Mia Hernandez and Nick Kehl presented to Council, as an extension of their presentation a few weeks back.

Following discussion, Agnela Jones made a motion to approve the change order in the amount of \$8,500 in the form of hourly rates as accrued for construction administration support through completion and close out of the Downtown Bike-Pedestrian Loop Project. Kathy Canady seconded the motion.

**Motion passed on vote of 3 ayes, 1 nay, and 0 abstentions. Chris Pezold opposed the motion.**

DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION TO APPROVE A WESTAR CONSTRUCTION CHANGE ORDER #2 IN THE AMOUNT OF \$6,228 FOR DRAINAGE IMPROVEMENTS AT DRIVEWAY 12, JUST PAST THE RAILROAD CROSSING ON LOOP 332, FOR THE LIBERTY HILL BIKE AND PEDESTRIAN LOOP PROJECT.

Nick Kehl stated he asked the contractor for an itemized bid and representation. They declined. He stated he recommends approval and reminded Council they are paying for 25% of this, or around \$1500. Chris Pezold stated he felt like the price was still too high.

Following Discussion, Kathy Canady made a motion to approve a Westar Construction Change Order #2 in the amount of \$6,228 for drainage improvements at Driveway 12 for the Liberty Hill Bike and Pedestrian Loop Project. Angela Jones seconded the motion.

**Motion passed on vote of 3 ayes, 1 nay, and 0 abstentions. Crystal Mancilla opposed the motion.**

DISCUSSION, UPDATE, AND POSSIBLE ACTION ON BROWNBRIDGE ROAD.

Kathy Canady addressed Council stating the City should take charge on what they can control on this intersection. Lacie Hale, City Administrator provided an update to plans and options. TxDOT has said that the stoplight at that intersection should be implemented in 2022.

UPDATE AND POSSIBLE ACTION FOR BROWNBRIDGE ROAD CONFIGURATION CHANGES.

Curtis Steger – Steger Bizzell addressed Council stating after listening to the gentleman providing public comments about the dangerous intersection, he is in agreement. There were a couple of options presented to Council which they deliberated. Mr. Steger stated he felt option B was the best solution.

On motion by Chris Pezold and second by Crystal Mancilla, Council approved Option B for configuration change on Brownbridge Road.

**Motion passed on vote of 4 ayes, 0 nays, and 0 abstentions.**

DISCUSS AND CONSIDER A RECOMMENDATION FROM THE PLANNING AND ZONING COMMISSION REGARDING AN ORDINANCE FOR A ZONE MAP AMENDMENT FROM AGRICULTURAL (AG) ZONING CLASSIFICATION TO MULTI-FAMILY RESIDENTIAL (MF2) ZONING CLASSIFICATION ON THE FOLLOWING PROPERTY:

AW0643 WEST, R. SUR., ACRES 10.52, (MHP-M1012) WILLIAMSON COUNTY, TEXAS; SPECIFICALLY, GENERALLY LOCATED ALONG THE WEST SIDE OF SH 29, BETWEEN CR 277 AND BEVERS RD., AND IDENTIFIED AS ASSESSOR'S PARCEL NUMBER R-023043.

Pam Mundo, Mundo and Associates presented stating this property would be re-zoned to MF2. Planning and Zoning unanimously approved recommending the zone map amendment to Council.

Following discussion, Chris Pezold made a motion to approve the Ordinance for a Zone Map amendment for the property. Crystal Mancilla seconded the motion.

**Motion passed on vote of 4 ayes, 0 nays, and 0 abstentions.**

DISCUSS AND CONSIDER A RECOMMENDATION FROM THE PLANNING AND ZONING COMMISSION ON AN ORDINANCE FOR A ZONE MAP AMENDMENT FROM GENERAL COMMERCIAL (C3) ZONING CLASSIFICATION TO LIGHT INDUSTRIAL / WAREHOUSING (I1) ZONING CLASSIFICATION ON THE FOLLOWING PROPERTY:

S11488 – KENNEDY SUB, BLOCK A, LOT 3 ACRES 0.691, WILLIAMSON COUNTY, TEXAS; SPECIFICALLY, GENERALLY LOCATED ALONG THE WEST SIDE OF SH 29, BETWEEN BEVERS RD. AND CR 277, AND IDENTIFIED AS ASSESSOR'S PARCEL NUMBER R-562347.

Pam Mundo, Mundo and Associates, presented stating the Planning and Zoning Commission met June 15 and unanimously approved this recommendation to Council.

Following discussion regarding concern for traffic, Chris Pezold made a motion to approve the zone map amendment, seconded by Kathy Canady.

**Motion passed on vote of 4 ayes, 0 nays, and 0 abstentions.**

DISCUSS AND CONSIDER ACTION TO APPOINT A LIBERTY HILL CITY COUNCIL REPRESENTATIVE TO CAPCOG.

Mayor Branigan stated the Capital Area Council of Governments generally meets twice a year. Kathy Canady stated she is interested. Council requested the bylaws to review which the City Administrator will provide to them.

On motion by Chris Pezold and second by Kathy Canady, this item was postponed allowing more time for Council to review and consider.

**Motion passed on vote of 4 ayes, 0 nays, and 0 abstentions.**

DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION ON CREATION OF POCKET PARK ACROSS FROM FOUNDATION PARK.

Mayor Branigan addressed Council stating she would like to see a pocket part created at this location. Following discussion, Council asked the City Administrator to return to Council with options.

DISCUSSION OF PLAN TO UPDATE THE CITY OF LIBERTY HILL'S COMPREHENSIVE PLAN.

Mayor Branigan addressed Council stating she has heard from the citizens, and they say there is not enough green space. Mayor Branigan stated that the City Council, along with Planning and Zoning, need to get to work on the Comprehensive Plan. Kathy Canady stated that the Mayor made an important point and that the City needed to get started on this. Ms. Hale, City Administrator, stated July 24 is the Council Retreat, and this item can be revisited.

CONSIDERATION AND POSSIBLE ACTION ON A RESOLUTION ADOPTING A RATE REVIEW MECHANISM TARIFF WITH ATMOS ENERGY.

Lacie Hale, City Administrator stated that since the last Council meeting, she had met with Chris Pezold and Atmos and as implementation would likely be 2022-2023, staff can do additional research. Council discussed.

On motion by Chris Pezold and second by Kathy Canady, Council postponed this item until legal can adequately review.

**Motion passed on vote of 4 ayes, 0 nays, and 0 abstentions.**

Mayor Branigan called for a break at 9:51 PM.

Mayor Branigan called the meeting back to order at 9:57 PM.

CONSIDERATION AND POSSIBLE ACTION TO AUTHORIZE THE CITY ADMINISTRATOR TO NEGOTIATE AND EXECUTE AN AGREEMENT WITH LIBERTY HILL ISD TO USE THEIR PROPERTY FOR THE JULY 3, 2021, EVENT.

Lacie Hale addressed Council stating this agreement will allow the city to use the property. On motion by Crystal Mancilla and second by Kathy Canady, Council authorized the City Administrator to negotiate and execute an agreement with the school district to use their property for the July 3, 2021, event.

**Motion passed on vote of 4 ayes, 0 nays, and 0 abstentions.**

CONSIDERATION AND POSSIBLE ACTION ON HIRING, RECRUITING, AND/OR APPOINTMENT OF CITY ATTORNEY.

Lacie Hale addressed Council stating last March, Council made a motion to use SGR to search for a city attorney. Recently, Ms. Hale pulled comparative records on costs for legal services, inhouse v. outsourced. Staff would like Council's guidance on moving forward with either an inhouse attorney or outsourcing of legal services, possibly with the Bojorquez Law Firm.

Following discussion, Chris Pezold made a motion to move forward with hiring the Bojorquez Law Firm as Liberty Hill's City Attorney. Kathy Canady seconded the motion.

**Motion passed on vote of 4 ayes, 0 nays, and 0 abstentions.**

On motion by Kathy Canady and second by Chris Pezold, Council authorized the termination of SGR.

**Motion passed on vote of 4 ayes, 0 nays, and 0 abstentions.**

DISCUSS AND CONSIDER DIRECTING STAFF TO PROVIDE UDC UPDATES / WITH PRIORITY OF (1) TREE MITIGATION; (2) ZONING SIGNAGE; AND (3) OUTDOOR LIGHTING.

Mayor Branigan said that with regard to outdoor lighting, the Dark Skies proponents would like to come back and talk with City Council. Kathy Canady said she thought it was time to stop talking and do something.

Lacie Hale stated that if Council so chooses, staff can get to work, following up with Planning and Zoning and then City Council.

Following discussion, Kathy Canady made a motion directing staff to begin the work on updating the UDC and set up workshops with Planning and Zoning. Chris Pezold seconded the motion.

**Motion passed on vote of 4 ayes, 0 nays, and 0 abstentions.**

UPDATE ON SIDE STREET / PARKING LOT SAFETY AND ACQUISITION OF SIGNAGE.

Kathy Canady addressed Council stating people know they should not be cutting through parking lots and speeding, but they need to be reminded. Lacie Hale stated she could look into available signage. The police department will continue to be vigilant about stopping unlawful and unsafe vehicle activity.

CONSIDERATION AND POSSIBLE ACTION ON PREVENTATIVE MAINTENANCE AND ASSET MANAGEMENT SOFTWARE FOR THE PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT.

Lacie Hale addressed Council stating she has learned that not all of our public works' infrastructure has been kept to the level it should be. She has looked at available programs to help monitor this, and one that has been recommended (PubWorks) is around \$2,300.

On motion by Crystal Mancilla and second by Angela Jones, Council authorized the City Administrator to sign an agreement with PubWorks.

**Motion passed on vote of 4 ayes, 0 nays, and 0 abstentions.**

DISCUSSION, CONSIDERATION, AND POSSIBLE ACTION TO APPROVE A SUMMER MUSIC SERIES AT THE WATER TOWER PARKING LOT IF SPONSORSHIPS ARE SECURED FOR FUNDING.

Katie Amsler, Communications Manager addressed Council stating the series would be in the Water Tower Parking Lot, all funded by sponsors. She would like to start this now with the hopes the series can be grown in the future.

On motion by Angela Jones and second by Chris Pezold, Council approved a summer music series at the Water Tower Parking Lot.

**Motion passed on vote of 4 ayes, 0 nays, and 0 abstentions.**

Mayor Branigan stated that the resident next to the parking lot should still get a fence and the music should end by 9 PM.

DISCUSS AND CONSIDER COUNCIL MANDATE FROM NOVEMBER 2020 TO NOT FILL BOARD AND COMMISSION SEATS UNTIL POLICY AND PROCEDURES REGARDING CRITERIA FOR MEMBERS HAVE BEEN ESTABLISHED BY COUNCIL.

Kathy Canady addressed Council stating she does not think it is right to fill seats when Council previously acted to put a hold on filling positions. Angela Jones responded that these seats have been on hold since October, and she thinks it is time to go ahead and fill those positions. However, Ms. Jones said that she is in favor of having a workshop to discuss term limits and makeup of boards and commissions, but after the open seats are filled.

**No action was taken.**

DISCUSS AND CONSIDER COUNCIL ROLES AT BOARD AND COMMISSION MEETINGS.

Kathy Canady addressed Council stating she thinks it is important to follow the Open Meetings Act and other statutes while attending board and commission meetings. Nella Joseph, attorney with the Bojorquez Law Firm, said that their firm has trainings and packets of information if Council should like that. She said that Council does have the right to state their views. Chris Pezold stated he has been against council members sitting on other boards because he believes it dilutes that board. Angela Jones agreed, stating that when someone sits on the City Council and then sits on another board as well, they are voting on an item on the board, and then voting on that same item at Council. She also

stated that she has attended a number of board and commission meetings since becoming a Councilmember and feels that that has provided additional context to those items advisory boards have brought before Council.

**No action was taken.**

DISCUSS AND CONSIDER APPOINTING A REPLACEMENT TO PLANNING AND ZONING COMMISSION VACANCY.

Angela Jones presented to Council stating there is an open board seat on the Planning and Zoning Commission, and she would like to see it filled. There was discussion of the applicants in general. The consensus of Council was that they would like to discuss the ideal number of seats and possible alternates for Planning and Zoning, and the upcoming workshop would be the time to do that.

Angela Jones made a motion recommending Mr. Chad Cormack to fill the vacancy. Chris Pezold seconded the motion.

**Motion passed on vote of 3 ayes, 1 nay, and 0 abstentions. Kathy Canady opposed the motion.**

DISCUSS AND CONSIDER RECOMMENDATION FROM THE PARKS AND RECREATION BOARD TO APPOINT LISA MESSANA TO VACANT PARKS BOARD POSITION.

Mary Lyn Jones, Parks and Recreation Board Chair addressed Council stating there is one opening on the Board. She said that the Parks Board recommends Lisa Messana.

Chris Pezold made a motion to appoint Lisa Messana to the vacant position on the Parks and Recreation Board until the end of the term in October 2021. Crystal Mancilla seconded the motion. Kathy Canady asked if she lived in City limits or the ETJ. The response was that she lives within the boundaries of the school district.

Angela Jones asked why Ms. Messana was recommended among the other applicants. The Parks Chair stated that Ms. Messana is very interested, very organized, and very involved in the community.

**Motion passed on vote of 3 ayes, 1 nay, and 0 abstentions. Kathy Canady opposed the motion.**

DISCUSS AND CONSIDER APPROVAL OF RECOMMENDATION FROM THE PARKS AND RECREATION BOARD TO PURCHASE TREES FOR CITY PARK NOT TO EXCEED \$15,000.

Following discussion of tree mitigation fund and developer fees, Council requested this item wait until budget for Fiscal Year 2021-2022 can be reviewed and workshop can be set up.

DISCUSS AND CONSIDER ENTERING INTO A COST-SHARING AGREEMENT WITH LIBERTY HILL ISD YOUTH LEAGUE FIELDS.

Mary Lyn Jones, Parks Chair addressed Council stating she and Jake Thomas met with LHISD Superintendent Snell about fencing the fields around the elementary school. There was discussion of where this money would come from. Ms. Hale stated it would come out of the new Streets and Maintenance budget.

No action was taken.

DISCUSS AND CONSIDER RECOMMENDATION FROM THE PARKS AND RECREATION BOARD FOR FUNDING YOUTH LEAGUE PROJECTS.

This item was discussed with along with the previous item.

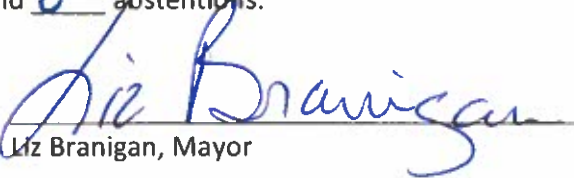
